

## All-Australian superheroes

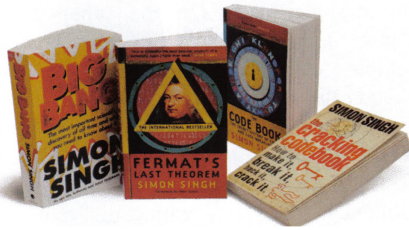
